San Elijo Middle School Music Program's Solo & Ensemble Festival Saturday, February 2nd (All Day, Schedule TBA)

The Music Program is proud to host the Solo and Ensemble Festival on the SEMS Campus. The festival is open to 7th and 8th grade musicians at SEMS and Double Peak, as well as musicians at SMHS, who selected to build their musicianship and showcase their talents in either solo or ensemble performances. There will be three performance venues: the Performing Arts Center for larger ensembles, the Library for solos and smaller ensembles, and the Gym for vocal groups and solos. Local music educators will be serving as judges for the students to give them comments on their performance. Students also receive written feedback from a judge with a rubric and rating. Each performer is awarded a ribbon based on their rating as a token of their hard work. Top performers are then invited to perform in a recital later in the year as a celebration of their dedication and talents. Mrs. Homes, one of Yamaha Music's "40 under 40" featured Music Educators, authored a wonderful and informative article on the Festival that can be found here. Our music community is invited to come and support our brave musicians throughout the day. Big things can come from small moments and that is what our Solo and Ensemble Festival does for our music program every year. This amazing event can not be successful without the help from volunteers. This all-day event requires a team to ensure everything runs smoothly, from friendly check-in table workers, to concession stand assistants, to door guards to make sure performances are not interrupted, we need a small army of volunteers to pull it off. CO-TREASURER

HOSPITALITY COORDINATOR (currently open)

Hospitality is responsible for planning and coordinating the food and beverages offered at band events. Important dates include Picture Day, Turkey Concerts, Winter Choir Concert, Solo & Ensemble Festival, Coffee Concert, and Jazz End of Year Concert.

JAZZ COORDINATOR

The Jazz Coordinator is responsible for scheduling and confirming all jazz band events, communicating with jazz band parents as well as ensuring that we have adequate transportation for the jazz band equipment/instruments.

MEDIA MASTER

The mediamaster runs the Facebook and Instagram Music Program as well as puts out the monthly newsletters to keep families informed of happenings in the program.

SECRETARY
