How do I choose an instrument?

The first few weeks of band, we do an instrument “petting zoo” where students can try out some of the different instruments offered to learn. These include flute, clarinet, trumpet, trombone, and baritone. We use special sterilizing spray on the mouthpieces and reeds in between each student who is trying the instrument.

Where can I get my instrument once I have picked it?

There are several options on getting an instrument. We have a limited number of instruments at school that we can loan to students. We work with two music stores in North County who also rent instruments. They are:
