Beginning Choir Syllabus 2021-2022 Welcome to the World of Music!

Introduction:

Beginning Choir is a 6-8th grade elective at SEMS. It is designed to allow students to learn how to sing for the first time, gain additional experience, and practice beginning to intermediate level music in a group ensemble. It meets every

day. Beginning choir is considered a regularly scheduled core subject and all attendance and grading procedures apply.



Objectives of Performing Arts:

Students will be expected to demonstrate:

- a knowledge of basic music theory and how it is applied to the vocal arts
- the acquisition of sufficient technical skill to produce satisfactory tone and ability in their chosen vocal range
- a working knowledge of music vocabulary and symbol identification.
- an ability to perform before an audience, demonstrate an understanding of skills in music performance techniques, including appropriate concert attire.

Tools for Success:

- Folder for music (generously provided by Band Boosters)
- Pencil
- Bottle of water for class
- Membership in the Google Classroom
- Knowledge of the <u>www.semschoir.com</u> website
- Concert Attire: Black SEMS Choir Shirt, Black Pants or Skirt, Black Socks or Tights, Black Shoes (black on black athletic shoes ok)

Grading:

Beginning Choir Grades are based on the following breakdown:

- Concerts/Performances: 30%
- Singing Tests/other assignments: 20% (late assignments are subject to -1 point per day that they are late)
- Class Rehearsal and Bringing Materials to Class: 50%

All choir students are expected to attend all performances as part of their semester grades. If an emergency/conflict arises, students/parents must email their director ASAP for further instructions.

Participation and effort are the most important aspects of choir class.

Behavior Expectations/Classroom Rules:

The Choir room at SEMS is a special place where you are safe to grow and learn. The great behavior of our students is part of what makes this happen. We all make mistakes at one time or another, but the important thing is to correct and learn from these mistakes. As a music student, you are expected to follow the class rules at all times.

There will be singing tests during each semester. Students are expected to practice the assigned passages and be prepared for these assessments. Advanced Choir members and the director are available for additional help. The first few assessments will be live and solo, so the director can assess students' vocal placement. Later on, students may submit the assessments via the Google Classroom or email.
